USTA NAMES DONNA SWANSON OF MOAPA VALLEY EMPOWERMENT HIGH TO THE 2015 NO-CUT COACH ALL-STAR TEAM

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y., Oct. 19, 2015 – The United States Tennis Association (USTA) today announced the 2015 No-Cut Coach All-Star Team, which includes Donna Swanson of Moapa Valley Empowerment High School in Overton, Nev. The No-Cut Coach All-Star Team recognizes 12 exceptional middle and high school coaches throughout the nation who implement a “no-cut” policy which welcomes all interested students to be a part of their school’s tennis team.

The No-Cut Coach All-Star Team was established in 2013 to recognize a select group of coaches nationwide for their special achievements in offering a “No-Cut Tennis” policy. Coaches are nominated by their respective USTA Section.

Swanson resides in Overton and has been teaching and coaching tennis at the school for the past 11 years. In 2013, she led the boys’ team to a first-place division finish, and in 2015 the girls’ team took home first-place division honors.

“These coaches play a critical role not only in the development of student-athletes throughout the year, but the success of No-Cut Tennis and the sport of tennis as a whole,” said Glenn Arrington, Director, USTA High School Tennis. “We are extremely proud of these coaches as they foster inclusion and continue to help shape and mold today’s youth into well-rounded student athletes.”

Since 2006, more than 4,000 tennis coaches nationwide have made a commitment to offering a no-cut policy, with some programs including more than 100 team members on a high school team. The coaches of these teams serve as positive role models and make a difference by spending the extra time and effort to ensure that young players experience the fun and fulfillment of playing tennis and participating in a school sport.

To qualify for the USTA No-Cut All-Star Team, coaches must be currently implementing a no-cut policy on their tennis teams, currently registered with the USTA as a “no-cut” coach, and coaching tennis for a minimum of five years.
